WEST SIDE STORY

On the mean streets of New York City two gangs are in a long-lasting duel. The Sharks, a Puerto Rican gang, grapple with the difficulties of assimilating into American society. The Jets, the American gang, want to resist newcomers entering their territory. In the midst of this rivalry Jet, Tony, falls in love with a beautiful Sharks' girl, Maria. After a fight between the Jets and the Sharks, Tony ends up killing Maria's brother, Bernardo. Bitter over losing Maria's love and the death of Bernardo, Maria's Puerto Rican suitor, Chino, seeks revenge.

Act 1

In the Prologue, a conflict between two rival teenage gangs, the Jets and the Sharks is enacted through dance, this establishes the fierce rivalry between the two groups with Riff, the leader of the Jets, and the members of the gang boasting of their strength. ("The Jet Song"). Riff and the Jets decide to initiate a rumble whilst at a local dance, with control of the neighbourhood as a prize for the winning gang. Riff struggles to get his best friend Tony to re-join the gang and come to the dance. He agrees out of a sense of loyalty to Riff, but expresses his unhappiness with his current life. ("Something's Coming").

Maria, the sister of the Shark leader, Bernardo, has only been in America a short time and sees the dance as the official beginning of her life in this country. Like Tony, she is full of hope. Bernardo arrives with Chino, who Maria's family has chosen to be her future husband.

A challenge dance crupts. Tony and Maria, meet and in a moment of romantic suspension, dance together, oblivious of the tension around them. After the dance, an ecstatic Tony sings of his new found love ("Maria"). As he sings, Maria appears on a fire escape above him. They profess their love for each other ("Tonight"). Whilst Anita and Rosalia, along with other Puerto Ricans, begin to express conflicting views about their lives in the United States ("America"), at the drugstore the shopkeeper, Doc, tries to convince the Jets not to have a rumble with the Sharks. The gang try to show Doc the pent-up tension they feel ("Cool").

The next day, Maria learns about the rumble from Anita. Maria begs Tony to stop the rumble and he promises her he will. They enact a mock marriage ceremony ("One Hand, One Heart") swearing that "even death can't part us now." Later that night everyone prepares for the rumble ("Tonight Quintet"). In the midst of the rumble, Bernardo stabs Riff. In blind fury, Tony angrily stabs Bernardo in an act of revenge. The sirens scream.

Act 2

Unaware of the tragedy Maria sings to her friends about her reactions to love ("I Feel Pretty") when Chino enters with the news Tony has killed Bernardo. Left alone, Maria is praying when Tony enters. They both imagine a new world where they can live together in peace and acceptance ("Somewhere").

Meanwhile Officer Krupke is questioning the Jets about the murders. The gang ridicule him and the other adults who fail to understand what motivates their behaviour ("Gee, Officer Krupke"). Anita arrives at Maria's apartment turning on Maria in fury for making love to the man who killed her own brother ("A Boy Like That"). However, when Maria explains ("I Have a Love"), Anita realizes Maria loves Tony as much as she loved Bernardo. Told that Chino has a gun and is planning revenge, Maria asks Anita to warn Tony but she is attacked by the Jets. In her fury and humiliation, Anita tells them how Chino has killed Maria. Tony, feeling there is nothing to live for now, runs out to find Chino.

Chino appears and shoots Tony. Still alive, but struggling, the Jets and Sharks flock around the lovers, Maria tries to pull Tony back from the brink of death ("Somewhere Reprise"). But Tony dies in Maria's arms. Taking Chino's gun she tells everyone that hatred is what killed Tony and the others, and that now she can kill them because their hate has affected her, but she collapses in her grief. Gradually, all the members of both gangs assemble together on either side of Tony's body.

Angela Briley - Director

"West Side Story" is rather a favourite of mine and after the success of "High School Musical" I was delighted to be asked back to direct this fabulous show. Natalie Wilson- Choreographer




Jake Davis - Riff
