

Then the day of the callbacks, the championship basketball game, and the scholastic decathalon comes (all thanks to Sharpay for demanding a

reschedule for the callbacks), Gabriella forgives Troy and they sing "Breaking Free" and win the lead.

The musical numbers cover all the bases, urban pop, salsa, ballads, etc. and offers plenty of scope for anyone interested in being part of the phenomenon that has become High School Musical.
